#### Targu Mures – Romania 20th-21st October 2022

For the second transnational meeting, we were hosted in Romania, in the charming town of Targu Mures, within the historic Transylvania region, with its medieval castle and quaint little cafes. This is the headquarters of two of our Project partners, Professional Foundation and Vocational Art School, who welcomed us warmly and enthusiastically.

As well as an intensive discussion on the planning of future project activities, we addressed in depth the issue of gender stereotypes in teaching STEAM subjects. We agreed to work on four stereotypes, considered the most representative, to develop Lesson Plans for teachers who will be part of the Training Program, our first project outcome, namely:

• Stereotype 1 - Girls are less interested in STEAM subjects than boys

• Stereotype 2 - The results obtained by a boy in STEAM are due to his quick mind rather than to study, while girls reach the same results, or better, thanks to constant engagement and effort



- Stereotype 3 Hard science is still profoundly associated with masculinity as most of the jobs in the STEAM take place outside of a lab
- Stereotype 4 Women are not successful in STEAM careers like engineering, science research, STEAM professions

For three days we participate in a Training for deconstructing the stereotypes and biases for including more girls in STEAM, hosted by our Spanish partner the University of Jaume I in the charming and warm Castellon de la Plana. Dazzled by the Gothic-style Concatedral de Santa Maria, E-STEAM project partners and several teachers and professors, had the opportunity to experience and confront training methods for STEAM and GENDER trainers, and pilot training activities to be implemented in the four European countries of the project (Belgium, Italy, Romania, Spain), and to establish a network among trained professionals and organizations.

Each partner had the opportunity to present its own in-depth lecture on the topic, and this allowed for engaging debates and discussions. Topics touched on varied from gender differences, first-person testimonies from a young scientist, workshops dedicated to gender stereotypes, and the creation of unedited content.

Participation in the training involved not only cognitive but also metacognitive experiential training. In order to move from knowing to knowing how to do, time was set aside for self-reflective review and constructive criticism of the entire course.
